Dear Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ at Black River Falls,

Peace be with you all. How is it with your soul in the midst of uncertainty and unrest? Does this question sound strange and heavy? This is a question with which John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, would open up all small group meetings.

As far as I am concerned, my heart, mind, and spirit are in a whirl. As you know, so much has been going since early 2020: the pandemic, civil unrest, divisions in our country and our church over discrimination, the presidential election, and the inauguration. It is no surprise that most of us have felt unhappy, isolated, dispirited, and frustrated.



So, I would like to ask you, "How are you?" in light of current situations in our lives. The question requires an answer deeper and more meaningful than any cliché such as "good" or "fine." Let us pause a little and ponder our current situations. I would like for you to consider some questions:

"How are you experiencing God in your life?" "How is your spiritual growth happening?" "Do you feel spiritually connected to God? and, if so, and in what ways are you pursuing a relationship with Jesus?" "How well are you sowing, harvesting, and spreading the fruits of the Spirit?" "How well are you using your spiritual gifts to spread scriptural holiness wherever you walk?" "How do you offer Christ to others through your words, actions, and intentions?" "Where have you consciously refrained from doing harm?" "Where have you done well as a faithful witness to Christ's love and God's grace?" These questions challenge us to share our struggles and testify to our faith.

So, I want to ask you again, "How really are you doing?" I don't want to take just a convenient answer, such as "I am good." For that reason, I encourage you all to figure out first who you are in God in order to answer that question appropriately. I believe we cannot help but repeat the same thing endlessly if we don't know of our identity.

Who am I? Where did I come from? What am I created to be? Where would you like to find right answers to those questions? The Bible answers, "You are all children of the light and children of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness" (1 Thessalonians 5:5).

Finally, I was inspired by the young poet who self-identified as a skinny Black girl descended from slaves and raised by a single mother; listening her poem resonated with the new vision for our country and the world at the inauguration ceremony of the 46<sup>th</sup> US president: "There is always light, if only we're brave enough to see it, if only we're brave enough to be it."

"For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8).

You are encouraged to make as a priority the preparation of your heart as we prepare to receive once again the mercy and grace of our Lord Jesus the Christ.

We begin our season of Lent this year on Ash Wednesday, February 17. We will have a virtual Ash Wednesday Worship Service at 6:00 p.m. via ZOOM. Details of that service and contact information will be sent out with your bulletins later.

On Wednesday evenings following Ash Wednesday, starting Wednesday, February 24, we will have a Bible Study beginning at 6:00 p.m. This will be available for everyone to participate via ZOOM. We will let everyone know the details of the study soon.

Donations were down slightly this year for our Christmas Giving tree but still 5 programs received additional and most likely much needed support from us.


Terrie Stevens had help from Ann and Terrie's daughter in the Twin Cities to get more items to the homeless shelters there.



During Lent some people give something up to spend more time with God, to get closer to Him. Some examples may be, screen time, video games, soda, chocolate, and the list goes on. Talk about it as a family, maybe there is an item for the whole family to give up. Adding something is an option as well, for example reading the Bible as a family, choosing Bible scripture and discussing it. Whatever you add or give up that is meaningful in drawing you and your family closer to God.

The total of our General Fund Expense Budget for 2021 is \$302,933.00. We have received 68 pledges to the General Fund of \$186,894.00. Thank you so much to everyone who has made a pledge so far. As always, your faithfulness and generosity to your church is appreciated so much.

The Capital Campaign Fund began in February 2018 and will end in December 2021. 44 pledges were made for a total of \$221,275.00. As of January 15, we have received \$206,296.00 in pledges leaving an unpaid balance of \$14,979.00. Most of the improvements and upgrades included in the campaign have been completed with the exception of carpeting/flooring replacement and lighting upgrades, which are both planned for sometime this year. Please continue to make your contributions and fulfill your pledges so that all the projects that were a part of the campaign can be completed this year. What Happened on This Day in the history of Christianity?

#### **Stubbornly Generous**

#### February 1



In the fifth century, according to Irish church tradition, a king impregnated a slave, and the baby, Brigid, was raised a servant who grew up grinding corn, washing feet, tending livestock, and giving the king's bacon to hungry dogs and his butter to working boys.

Losing patience, he took her nearby intending to sell her. He entered the castle to settle the arrangements. A leper passed by, and Brigid gave him her father's battle sword from the chariot. The king was enraged, and the prospective husband backed out, saying that he could not afford such a wife.

Brigid was beautiful and full of spunk, and since she loved music and conversation, her father arranged her marriage to a poet. But resolving to belong only to Christ, Brigid found the man another wife, then deserted the castle.

Her father thought it good riddance.

Brigid sought other women wanting to belong only to Christ, and with seven of them she organized a community of nuns like the communities of monks established by Patrick. The monastic settlement at Kildare became a buzzing compound within a great stone wall and peppered with thatched-roof buildings. Artists' studios, workshops, guest chambers, a library, and a church evolved. This and similar settlements became beehives of industry, producing some of the most beautiful craftsmanship in Europe. The slaves and the poor bettered their lot by becoming artisans.

Brigid herself traveled by chariot as an evangelist through the countryside, helping the poor, preaching the gospel, and organizing nunneries. By her death on **February 1**, **c. 453**, 13,000 women had escaped from slavery and poverty to Christian service and industry. Throughout ensuing centuries, Christians across Ireland have placed St. Brigid's crosses of woven straw over their doors on February 1, and housekeepers have repeated a rhyme bidding them give a portion of their butter to working boys.

"If you forget to bring in a stack of harvested grain, don't go back in the field to get it. Leave it for the poor, including foreigners, orphans, and widows, and the Lord will make you successful in everything you do." - Deuteronomy 24:19
