Dear Beloved,

I'm thinking that you will get this newsletter just before the end of the year or shortly after the first of the year. Either way, we will still be finishing the Christmas season that runs from Christmas Day through the sixth of January (Epiphany Day). I always think it so strange that once Christmas Day is done most people would say Christmas is over. But the gift of Jesus Christ to the world is a gift that we need to be reminded of every day. Without his life, death and resurrection, you and I would live meaningless lives.

I read an excerpt from a book today ("The Very Best, Hands-on, Kinda Dangerous Family Devotions" by Tim Shoemaker) in which a dad took his three sons to watch the races at a local race track. The boys had great fun but on the way home they noted that it was just a bunch of men going around in circles and most of them ended about where they started and so they gained nothing. The point of the story was that living by the world standards we simply keep going around in circles and gain nothing. Matthew 16:26 states "What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?"

As Christians, Disciples of Jesus Christ, we live in and by the power of the Holy Spirit. We have both a purpose and a destination. This leads me to share with you three opportunities for you to clarify your purpose in Christ's Kingdom in this world and to look forward to the Heavenly Kingdom that is yet to come.

First, I will be facilitating a class Sunday mornings. The class is on "Soul Keeping." How do we go about taking care of our soul as children of God? We will be watching a video, answering some group questions and then have time between sessions for reflection. The plan is to start at 10:30am and be done by 11:30am. I pray that you will be bold and sign up for the class. There will also be a study Thursday evenings on the Gospel of John.

Secondly, I will begin on January 12<sup>th</sup> a sermon series on the Book of Romans. We are going to roam through Romans and take a look at Paul's road to salvation. Why do we need a savior? How can we be saved? What does that mean in my life? What practical applications can we incorporate into our lives that will make a difference for us and for those around us? Why not invite a friend or two to come to church with you so they too can hear what Paul has to say to us.

OK! One last thing. Never forget the gift of LIFE that you have received through Jesus the Christ. Pass the gift on. Maybe you have heard the song 'The Gift Goes On' by Sandi Patty. Here are the lyrics:

The Father gave the Son, the Son gave the Spirit
The Spirit gives us life, so we can give the Gift of love
And the Gift goes on
Don't you love to get a present, wrapped up in a Christmas bow
God gave each of us a present, on that night so long ago
It's a Gift that keeps on giving, if our spirits can receive
It's the secret joy of living, if our hearts can just believe


## Van Etta Library BOOK REVIEW
