Dear Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ at BRF,

Peace be with you. I pray all of you are doing well in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic. Because so many of us have been vaccinated, we can now worship God in person and all together in our beautiful sanctuary. This makes me so very glad. However, as the Center for Disease Control and Prevention reminds us, it is still possible to contract Coronavirus so we need to use care.



After I moved to BRF, I bought two plots at the community garden to plant some vegetables, because I can't plant any vegetables or seeds by our place. My wife, Esther, loves growing vegetables. When Esther and I saw our plots at the community garden, they were so weedy it would have been hard to plant seeds and seedlings. Our plots were not used last year. After Jim and Carol Hornby tilled the land two times and uprooted weeds with efforts, Esther and I were able to plant seeds and seedlings in the well-turned soil. I appreciate it.

I realized that the soil must be soft and not have any weeds in order for the seeds and seedlings to be planted and grow. As Jesus taught people about the secrets of the kingdom of God in the parable of the sower, the seed sown on good soil produced crops, some multiplying thirty, some sixty, some a hundred times. Other seeds that had fallen along the path, or on rocky places, or among thorns were unfruitful, as a farmer would have expected.

As children of God, we come to church to listen to God's word. It is true that not all believers can be fruitful in terms of faith in God. Only those, like seed sown on good soil, who hear the word and accept it, produce a crop--some thirty, some sixty, some a hundred times what was sown. What is required of us to be productive? I believe the most important element is the condition of the soil to be sown, that is, our heart. If our spirit is too weak and tempted by Satan, if our mind is not solid and alert, if our heart has a lot of worries about this life, or the deceitfulness of wealth and the desires for other things, we cannot bear the fruits of the Holy Spirit and grow spiritually.

Let us take a moment and think of whether our heart and mind and spirit are good and soft enough to listen to and accept God's word and consequently, produce the fruits of the Spirit.

As I recall, tilling was very hard because the soil was hardened. That is why Jim came twice to till our garden. In the same manner, it is hard to renew and refresh our heart and spirit when our heart is stubborn and unfaithful. But it is necessary to be fruitful. Otherwise, we cannot bear the abundance. What keeps us most from bearing the fruits of the Spirit? I would like to share with you these Bible verses so that you could prepare for the fruitfulness.

Ephesians 4:31-32 says, "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Let us look into ourselves first before we come to God. I pray for all of you to live abundant lives and bear amazing fruits of the Holy Spirit.





What Happened on This Day in the History of Christianity?

Justin came from Palestine, born soon after the death of the apostle John. His wealthy, pagan parents had given him a splendid education, and Justin proved brilliant. But though his mind was filled with philosophy, nothing filled his heart. That is, not until he met the old man by the sea sharing the gospel.

Justin immediately began telling everyone that Christ can satisfy both mind and heart. He presented his case for Christianity clearly, defending the gospel so effectively that he is known as one of the church's first and finest apologists (defenders of the faith). He became a teacher in Ephesus, then moved to Rome and opened a Christian school. He wrote books advancing the Christian message, three of which still survive including a remarkable dialogue with a Jew in Ephesus named Trypho, a survivor of the Bar Kochba War. Justin skillfully explained the reasons Trypho should consider Christianity as a sound and reasonable faith.

In the mid-160s while teaching in Rome, he debated a cynic named Crescentius who held that virtue alone was the goal of life. Justin won the contest so decisively that Crescentius, enraged, apparently reported Justin to the Roman prefect and brought him before the court on charges of atheism—that is, of not believing in the gods of Rome. Justin and several others were condemned, flogged, and beheaded. He has since been known as Justin Martyr, and his life is remembered every year by the church in both East and West on his feast day, June 1.

Everything you were taught can be put into a few words: Respect and obey God! This is what life is all about. God will judge everything we do, Even what is done is secret, whether good or bad.
