

Under the "Safer at home" declaration, groups of less than ten can meet as long as they are following safe social distancing guidelines. Thus, we have been doing live worship with a maximum of six people at the church. Under phase one of the "Badger Bounce Back" protocol, we have no changes. Thus for the foreseeable future, we will continue to worship via radio and Facebook. The Wisconsin Council of Churches put out a release on April 23rd titled "Returning to Church – Ministry during the COVID-19 outbreak." That document gives us guidelines to follow as the state progresses through the three phases outlined in "Badger Bounce Back."

As your pastor, I have been trying to be spiritually supportive by sending out emails, placing the same information on our Facebook page and keeping you all in my thoughts and prayers. Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope this finds you well, physically, mentally and spiritually. The Covid-19 pandemic has forced all of us into actions and inactions that we never expected. Our congregation faces this new challenge of being

unable to meet for corporate worship on Sunday morning. We have shifted into an online worship service thanks to the flexibility of our pastor and our techies. We are certainly grateful for their efforts.

Above all, we are concerned about the health and safety of our congregants. With that in mind, we are looking at how and when we can resume "normal" operations at Black River Falls United Methodist Church. Our Wisconsin Conference released a plan for return to normal and we intend to follow this plan.

We are currently observing the shelter in place directive. Essentially, this means online church services and bible studies. We will shortly be moving to Phase One of this plan which includes: Online church services, bible study and church meetings; weddings and funerals with attendance of 10 or fewer participants maintaining social distancing; church office work kept to essential functions only; and people at greatest risk (those over 60 and those in poor health or compromised immune systems) to continue to shelter in place. This phase is to continue until our communities see continuing declining case counts, widespread availability of testing, contact tracing and no PPE shortages.

These criteria are difficult to calculate and assess. As we see additional testing we will naturally see increased case counts even if the situation is improving. Nevertheless, we will update our congregants as our options open and we are free to open our doors. When we are free to open our doors again, we cannot expect the church to continue with operations as they existed before Covid-19. For the foreseeable future we will be observing social distancing, encouraging the use of protective masks and gloves, limiting contact such as handshakes or hugs, eliminating sharing food or drinks, and encouraging those at risk to continue to shelter in place while worshiping from home.

During these transitions, we can expect divisions to arise in our state and nation as people with differing opinions voice their views. It is my prayer that our community in Christ holds on to the Gospel and virtually hold on to each other as we remember the love which binds us together. That love is stronger than the divisions. We will emerge from this as unified and faithful as we choose to be.

Please watch for additional emails and bulletins to learn about options for study on Sundays and possibly other days of the week as well. As always, contact the church office with questions and concerns.
