Brothers and Sisters in Christ at BRF,

Peace and grace be with you. I hope you are doing well this Lent season. As we feel winter has ended and spring has come, it has been unusual to have warm weather in winter season in Wisconsin lately. I don't remember any year when the month of February was warmer than this year. I have found already the unknown green plants sprang up through the ground. Although I like this warmth, I am concerned about climate change in the future.

How is your Lenten journey doing? As you know, Lent is a period of grief that necessarily ends with a great celebration of Easter, which is on March 31<sup>st</sup> this year. I want to remind you that the purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer for Easter through prayer, mortifying the flesh, repentance of sins, almsgiving, simple living, and self-denial. Many Christians commit to fasting, as well as giving up certain luxuries in imitation of Jesus Christ's sacrifice during his journey into the desert for 40 days.

Why do we need such spiritual practices? As you know, a human being is a unity of body, mind, and spirit. Just as the physical body grows as we get older, so our soul should grow accordingly and our emotions as well.

How does the soul grow? Romans 3:23 says, "*For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God*" and we all are justified freely by grace through the redemption of Jesus Christ. In other words, Jesus Christ is our Savior whom we must follow and resemble. We should grow up to Him. "*We will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ*" in Ephesians 4:15.

In order to become like Him in every respect, we should do whatever is needed. As any athlete needs to practice to win the competition, we need to practice every spiritual discipline to be mature spiritually and obey God. We need spiritual muscles to prevent us from our spiritual stagnancy and to win over any temptation. I am not sure if we can grow spiritually without spiritual disciplines, such as prayer, reading the Bible, corporate worship experience, etc.

This lent season is a great time for us to examine ourselves and practice spiritual disciplines to be mature Christians so that we can be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ to fulfill God's mission.

I pray for all of you to keep up this spiritual journey harder.

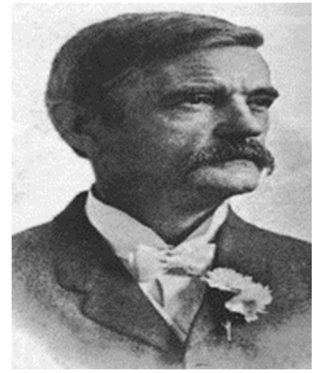

## What happened on this day?

### Sam Jones vs. Sam Jones

#### March 5



John J. Jones felt God calling him into the ministry, but he resisted, choosing instead the profession of law. His son followed in his footsteps. Young Sam Jones (1847-1906) proved a brilliant attorney at first.

But alcoholism quickly ruined his life and reduced him to shoveling coal. He was on a drinking binge when he heard of his father's illness. He rushed home, and the old lawyer became a preacher at last, saying, "My poor, wicked, wayward, reckless boy. You have brought me down in sorrow to my grave. Promise me, my boy, to meet me in heaven."

Sam fell to his knees and promised, then he flew to a bar and begged for a glass of liquor. But as he started to drink it, he saw himself in the mirror. Hair matted. Filth and vomit on his clothes. Lips swollen. He smashed the glass on the floor and gave his life to Jesus Christ. A week later, he preached his first sermon.

Jones became the most famous evangelist of the nineteenth century, save for Moody. He held crusades in major cities throughout America, winning an estimated 500,000 people to Christ. His most unusual revival began on **March 5, 1899**, in Toledo, Ohio. The mayor of Toledo was also named Sam Jones. Mayor Jones introduced Evangelist Jones on the revival's opening night. The next mayoral election was only a month away, and he enjoyed the exposure.

But he didn't enjoy what Evangelist Jones had to say, for the preacher lost no time in attacking the mayor's policies. There were 700 saloons and 150 gambling dens in Toledo, and city administrators were unconcerned about it.

The evangelist said that if the devil were mayor of Toledo, he wouldn't change a thing. He flailed away at alcohol and sin. He lifted high the cross, and preached with the zeal of a lawyer trying to save his client from the gallows. Men wept. Women groaned. Children were spellbound. The seats were packed night after night. Hundreds, perhaps thousands, were converted during the Toledo meetings.

But the mayor won reelection the next month by a huge margin. Who is always in trouble? Who argues and fights?

Who has cuts and bruises? Whose eyes are red?

Everyone who stays up late, having just one more drink.

Don't even look at that colorful stuff Bubbling up in the glass!

**13) Acts 15:9**

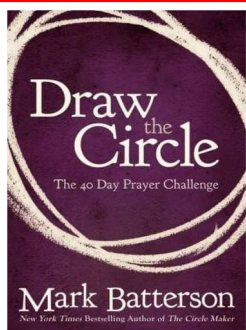

### During Lent, 7:14 am

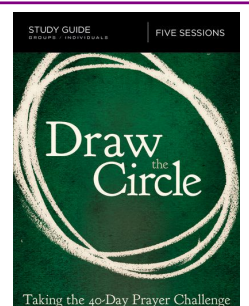

## A Testimony to Fresh Expressions Conference

Charlotte, NC, February 7-9, 2024



The Fresh Expressions movement began more than 15 years ago in Great Britain. It began and was built on John Wesley's teachings. At Aldersgate, he had a Holy Spirit revelation, an **"awakening and warming of his heart"** that affirmed God's love for him. This was something that he had not felt before but later changed the way he preached. He spoke that the church had moved away from Jesus' teaching, moved away from being the disciples that God wants us all to be. This revelation also brought forward the reality that those we should be mentoring or helping have been shunned or marginalized. And so it is today. These people, God's people, are not in our church. They remain shunned and marginalized. Some are in plain sight and others are hidden away in our community. The Fresh Expressions conference told and demonstrated to me and others, "that we're just not going to take it anymore." That we should begin again to live our lives as God has directed helping others, especially those that are troubled or have lost their way.



The Fresh Expressions movement is not evangelism. We most likely will not see an increase in the number of people who attend our church. However, we will do what God has asked us to do by meeting people where they are at. For now we are going to invite others to come to us. One way to do this is through Dinner Church. To join us in fellowship over a meal as Jesus so often did. It will be our intent that for that short while everyone will feel and know God's love. Know they are important.

This is hard work. I have heard rumblings amongst some that Dinner Church is a crazy idea. We have few resources and few volunteers to help. But, we can do this! God has called me to be a part of this. Search your heart. What is God asking you to do?

My mother had taken three falls, and I was surprised to see her frail body in a wheelchair when I stopped for my weekly Wednesday visit. I asked her how she was as I gave her a big hug. She was teary-eyed and responded, “I am old and useless.” Sadness crept into my heart and I replied, “You are not useless to me!”

I wheeled her into her room and we went about our usual Wednesday routine-watering her plants, playing Scrabble, opening, and reading her mail, and doing a crossword puzzle. Our regular walks hadn't occurred more recently, and so we read the devotional in her room instead of on our walking break. My mother and father always read the “Upper Room” devotional each night before they went to bed. My bedroom was across the hall, and I remember fondly listening to them read the Bible passage and then the devotional each night. It warmed my heart and comforted me as I listened from my bed. On occasion when they would invite me into the bedroom for the devotional, I was so honored. This was their sacred shared time, and they were inviting me in!

I turned to the Wednesday devotional in the large print “Upper Room” and we began reading it out loud to each other. Imagine our surprise when the story was about a senior citizen feeling useless and unable to do anything. The writer went on to discuss how the Bible verse made her rethink this idea. She decided that she could pray for people all day long, and that she could share her smile with others. She could be cheerful and friendly to those she came into contact each day!

Mom and I smiled at each other. “See, Mom, you are not useless! You can pray, you can sing, you can smile your sweet smile!” God always finds a way to show us he is listening.

**Prayer:** Dear Lord, thank you. You hold each of us in your hands and want the best for us. Help us to see that we can always do something for others, and that prayer might be one of the best ways to help! Show us how valuable we are to others. Amen.

My mother, Ruth Hart, passed away on February 10, 2024. She is with my father, Lyle, now and with our Father in heaven.

My parents were married in June of 1960. They celebrated 58 years of marriage in 2018, and then my father passed away in January, 2019. Their love was a special, quiet, compassionate love. The way they treated each other and kept God beside them in their marriage was a thing of beauty. I cannot remember a time when I saw my parents argue. They loved and respected each other, shared so many things, and shared their love with their family and friends.

After my father passed away, we had to clean out our childhood home they had lived in since 1964. There were so many treasures to be found—diaries, vacation records, old pictures, and love letters. One of the notes we found was a scribbled note from my father describing my mother—Ruth. His writing is so distinct and my heart smiles as I read his note. There is no date, and we don't know why he wrote this. Perhaps one day he was just feeling blessed and decided to put pen to paper.

He wrote: *“Under-bearing, soft spoken, sweet voice, offers space to me, kind thoughts, Christian approach, good cook, no drama, battles; loves me. A good mother, grandmother; likes music. This is Ruth (Hart).”*

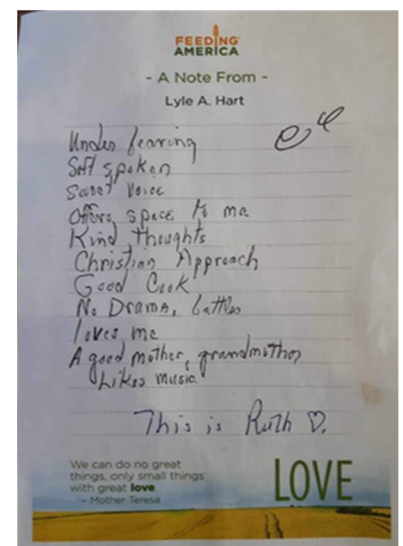
We shared this note with Pastor Inwha Shon for the funeral so that he might see what their love had been like. He became pastor of the church after my father had passed away, and only saw mom in her assisted living facilities. He asked the gathered group of family and friends, “Who has a love like this? Who has this kind of note from their spouse?!”

Wouldn't we all want to have a love story like this? Traveling through life with your true love and best friend, knowing that your lives are in God's care. I believe that my parents' faith guided their love throughout their lives. The church and God were so important to them; their home was always open to others, and they shared their love with family, friends, and those in need. They were guided by the One Above.

Every night, they sat on their bed together to read the Upper Room devotional and the Bible verse for the day. This is one of my most treasured memories. I know that my parents went to bed each night secure in the love of their Father and in the love that they shared.

They are together again, and I am so very happy for them. Love is eternal.

**Prayer:** Dear Father, thank you for earthly love. Thank you for giving us hearts and minds to think and feel, to share with one another, to be compassionate and kind. Help us to reflect Your love each and every day. Amen.

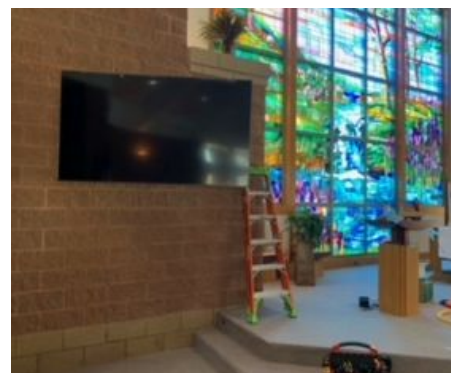

## *From Your BRF UMC Finance Committee*

### **March 2024 Update**

We ended 2023 on a positive note! Our income to the General Fund broke even with the expenses that's we had incurred. We were able to meet our obligation to the WI Annual UMC Conference apportionments for 2023 as well.

As of Feb 20th, 2024, we had about \$15,000 in the General Fund checking where most of the payments for bills comes from.

For 2024:

Expected income of \$275,690.00

Expected expenses of \$279,208.40

We are pleased with the 2024 General Fund drive with pledges and expected income able to meet expenses in 2024.

We recently had the Pledge Drive to help cover the Expenses of the Audio & Video System for the sanctuary as well and the cost of the new boiler for the heating system in the older part of the church. We had asked for \$40,000 to cover the remaining costs of these two Capital expenses. As of Feb21st, we have received donations of \$37,555.00. This is outstanding. If there are any other members who have not contributed to this Fund Drive, we certainly would appreciate your help as well. There will be additional Capital Expenses in 2024 which will require money to be spent.

Again a BIG Thank You to all who contributed. A list of givers will be posted in the April 2024 newsletter.

We invite all women to join us for our monthly meeting held on the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday at 5:30pm and to also be a part of our local and international programs.

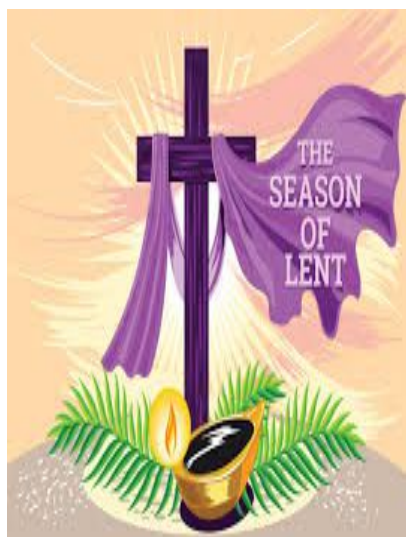
