Dear brothers and sisters in Christ at BRF,

Grace and peace be with you. I pray for all of you to be well amid the long difficult times. Nobody knows when this pandemic will end. Lately, as I take I-94 to go to church, what I see now is quite different from that of last month. Nature seems to not care about us- whose mind and hearts are struggling with COVID-19.



As you surely notice, it is autumn season and leaves fall on the ground all over town. We can't miss the beauty of fall colors which are the mixture of red, orange, yellow, and purple. I have always wondered how these autumn leaves change their colors. I have searched and figured out that this splendor of the fall is the result of chemical processes that take place in the tree as the seasons change from summer to winter.

According to an article of science I have read recently, during the spring and summer the leaves make food from sunlight and water so that the tree can grow. This food-making process takes place in the leaf in numerous cells containing 'chlorophyll,' which gives the leaf its green color. But in the fall, because of changes in the length of daylight and changes in temperature, the leaves stop their food-making process. The chlorophyll breaks down, the green color disappears, and the yellow to orange colors become visible.

At the same time other chemical changes may occur, which form additional colors through the development of red anthocyanin pigments. Some mixtures give rise to the reddish and purplish fall colors of trees such as dogwoods and sumacs, while others give the sugar maple its brilliant orange. The autumn foliage of some trees show only yellow colors. Others, like many oaks, display mostly browns. All these colors are due to the mixing of varying amounts of the chlorophyll residue and other pigments in the leaf during the fall season.

This changing colors of leaves remind me of the relationship with God. As we feed on God's Word and pray for God every day, we grow and get closer to God. And we can flavor the splendor of Jesus Christ through our lives to others as the leaves show green color. But if we lack God's Word and prayer, we gradually get further from God and lose its splendor and fall down. Although our outer lives may be gorgeous and prosperous, our inner lives could be dead or lukewarm.

We see the autumn leaves and its beauty, but it is not alive - it is dead. The leaves no longer grow and attach to the tree. It falls down and disappears. Just as the tree needs sunlight and water for its growth, so we need the light and water of our life, Jesus Christ our Lord. Let us dwell in Him.

# COLLECTION


With colder weather just around the corner, Terrie Stevens is organizing a collection of needed items for homeless people.

#### What Happened On This Day in the History of Christianity?

#### The Fifteenth Point - October 1

Unity is essential among Christians, but unity does not mean uniformity; and one of the most remarkable patterns in church history is that God uses his church and blesses his children even when they disagree. History's first missionary team, Paul and Barnabas, argued over John Mark. Wesley and Whitefield were at odds over various points of theology. And the Reformers themselves, strong-willed men, crossed swords over, among other things, the nature of the Lord's Supper.

The Swiss Reformers, led by Ulrich Zwingli, insisted that the Lord's Supper was a memorial service, while the German Reformers, led by Martin Luther, insisted that Christ is actually present in the consecrated bread and wine.

The conflict was so sharp that a local political leader invited the men to his castle in Marburg on October 1, 1529. In the banquet hall a long table, covered with a velvet runner, sat in the middle of the room. Before the proceedings began, Luther reportedly took a piece of chalk and, on the cloth in front of him, wrote the words, "This is my body."

The debate raged for three days. Zwingli insisted that the verb "is" in the phrase "This is my body" should be interpreted as "represents." Luther said, "Where in the Bible does the verb â€is' ever mean â€represent'?" Zwingli showed him several places. But Luther wouldn't budge. At the end of the three-day conference, the delegates had agreed on 14 of 15 areas of former confusion.

But on the fifteenth—the Lord's Supper—they failed to reach agreement, and the Reformers were unable to join the German and Swiss factions. As a result, Zwingli lost the support of the German princes. The five Catholic Cantons of Switzerland sent an army against him, and he died in the Battle of Kappel. But nothing could stop the Reformers' fire, and despite the failure of the Marburg meetings, the doctrine of justification by grace through faith spread across the continent.

During the meal Jesus took some bread in his hands. He blessed the bread and broke it. Then he gave it to his disciples and said, "Take this. It is my body." Jesus picked up the cup of wine and gave thanks to God. He gave it to his disciples, and they all drank some. Then he said, "This is my blood,

which is poured out for many people...."
